Introduction:

The Library Development Committee plays a crucial role in enhancing the quality, accessibility, and resources of the university library. This report covers the structure, roles and responsibilities, and the reporting process.

The LDC seeks to improve Library Resources to expand and diversify the library's collection of resources to meet the evolving needs of the university community. This includes acquiring new books, journals, e-resources, and multimedia materials across various academic disciplines.

Committee Structure:

The University Library Development Committee comprises members who are nominated for each academic year considering variables as competence and operates with the following structure:

The Library Committee members are nominated for each academic year to provide overall leadership and direction for the university's library activities. They preside over meetings, facilitate decision-making processes, and act as a liaison between the committee and the library administration.

Functions:

Each member of the University Library Development Committee plays specific function to achieve success.

- **Improving Library Infrastructure:** The committee focuses on improving the physical, electronic and database infrastructure of the library, ensuring it provides a conducive environment for studying, research, and collaboration. This involves renovations, upgrades to technology and equipment, and creating spaces that cater to different learning styles and preferences.
- **Promoting Information Literacy:** The committee aims to enhance information literacy skills among students, faculty, and staff. It collaborates with librarians and academic departments to develop programs, workshops, and resources that educate users on effective research techniques, critical evaluation of information, and ethical use of resources.
- The committee also is engaged in the reviewing processes of materials and other library resources as well as recommending necessary changes.
- Conducting various user surveys to collect feedback and auditing library stocks are other key responsibilities of the committee.
- **Strengthening Collaborations:** The committee actively seeks collaborations with faculty, students, and external organizations to foster partnerships that benefit the library and the university community.

Reporting:

The Library Development Committee maintains a structured reporting process to ensure transparency and accountability in its activities. Regular reporting is crucial for tracking progress, evaluating the effectiveness of initiatives, and identifying areas for improvement. The committee follows the following reporting procedures:

The committee prepares a report of the events and its performance at the end of academic year and submits the same to the Head of Operations for review and take necessary actions for improvement.



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
